### **"Infections in the Garden"**

More seriously, there are many hidden perils when working in the garden. Most of us are inundated with warnings of the hazards of using "chemicals" but little is said regarding the dangers of bacteria, fungi, protozoa, and even worms found in the horticultural materials we commonly handle.

Come to the June meeting and find out about the horrors that await you in the garden. This lecture is not for the hypochondriacs among us!

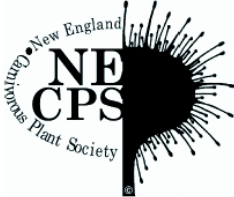
